FIRST READING: Ezekiel 33:7-11

¹¹ Besides this, you know what time it is, how it is already the moment for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we became believers; ¹² the night is far gone; the day is near. Let us then throw off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; ¹³ let us walk decently as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in illicit sex and licentiousness, not in quarreling and jealousy. ¹⁴ Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

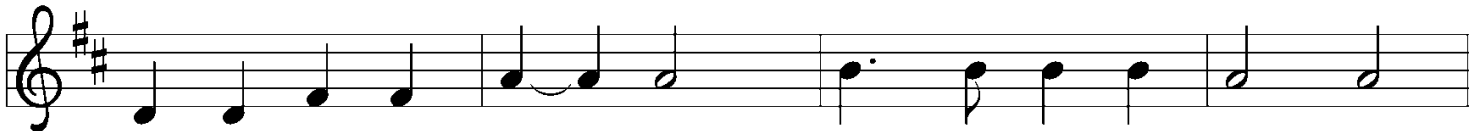

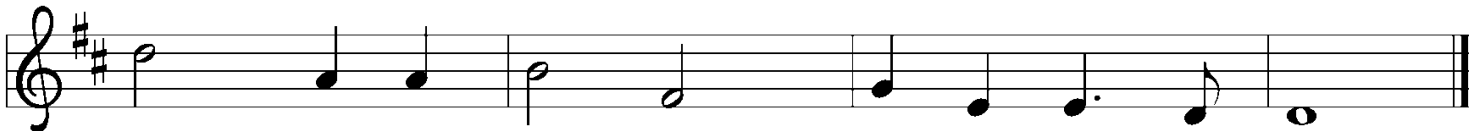

HEALTH MINISTRY TIP

Walking Clears Your Mind and Strengthens Your Heart

Walking is more than exercise. It is a simple, practical whole-person health plan that can nurture the mind, spirit, body, and relationships - one step at a time.

MENTAL HEALTH A walk can reduce tension, interrupt worry, improve mood, and create space for clearer thinking. Even a brief walk may help you reset when the day feels crowded or stressful.	SPIRITUAL HEALTH Walking can become prayer in motion. Notice God's creation, breathe slowly, give thanks, or pray for others as you go. Quiet steps can make room to listen as well as speak.
PHYSICAL HEALTH Regular walking supports the heart and circulation, strengthens muscles and bones, helps balance and stamina, and can assist with blood pressure, blood sugar, sleep, and healthy weight.	SOCIAL HEALTH Walking with a buddy adds conversation, encouragement, accountability, and safety. A shared walk can lessen loneliness and strengthen a caring relationship.

A SIMPLE WHOLE-PERSON WALK	Choose a safe route. Start at a comfortable pace. Invite a friend when possible. During the walk: notice your breathing, offer a prayer, enjoy conversation, and pay attention to how your body feels. Consistency matters more than speed.
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"What does the LORD require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?"

- Micah 6:8 (NRSVUE)

Walk wisely: Wear supportive shoes, carry water when appropriate, and use a cane or walking aid if prescribed. If you have been inactive or have heart, breathing, balance, or joint concerns, ask your healthcare professional how to begin safely. Stop and seek help for chest pressure, severe shortness of breath, faintness, or sudden weakness.

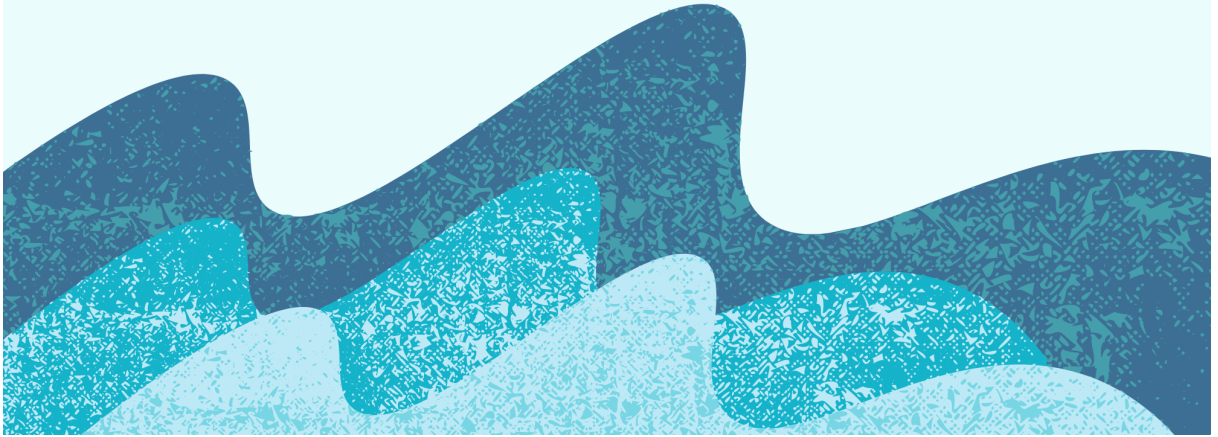
